## **Pastors' Letter for the June Parish Messenger**

"In those days there was no king in Israel. Everyone did what was right in their own eyes." Judges 21:25

Recently in our daily Bible reading, Pastor Sally and I read through the book of Judges which ends with the verse above. It is a pretty challenging book to get through, filled with the endless cycle of the Chosen people of God turning away from him and worshipping false gods, being punished for their sin, and then being rescued by God under the leadership of an appointed Judge. The book has a lot of blood and guts, one disappointing scene after another, anarchy and rebellion, and yet also the faithfulness of God towards his recalcitrant people.

It seems like lately there is this endless debate about what should and should not be done in response to the Covid crisis, one expert says one thing, the next another, one drug is fine to use or is another better, and on and on. In one sense all this is understandable, situations evolve, and knowledge grows, but really where is the truth in all this, or vie. In some ways the church like other entities which have institutional undertones, is the victim of all these clashing theories, we want to play it safe, but all these suggestions feel like a weight hunching us down.

Whether you like what we are doing in opening up or not, whether you are worshipping with us or not, please know that we are trying to do our best, not our own thing but God's; our best for our parishioners, our best for the witnessing of the Gospel, etc. Does all this mean that in the end our decisions will necessarily be right, well actually no. So, thanks for your patience, forgive our mistakes and lets all pray for one another, our Lord knows we need it!
