



His Gospel account of the life of Jesus and the history of the Early Christian Church, which he shares through the Book of the Acts of the Apostles, are as beloved as is their writer. Luke brings what he calls an “orderly account” of the life, death, resurrection, and ministry of Jesus and its urgent importance. Luke then follows it up with his singular account that profiles the work of Peter, John, Paul, and other apostles. In his carefully crafted manuscripts, we find faith-supporting history and are given an eyewitness account of God at work for us. We thank God that by the working of the Holy Spirit, the message of St. Luke has reached us today!

# Listening for the Promise

## Weekly Devotional

Pentecost 20 - October 18, 2020

*“For not only has the word of the Lord sounded forth from you in Macedonia and Achaia, but your faith in God has gone forth everywhere, so that we need not say anything.”*

- 1 Thessalonians 1:8 -

When I was a young person, I never would have thought of myself as being a missionary. As I've gotten older and more mature in the faith, I have come to recognize that all of us are missionaries for Christ, even if we don't leave our own hometown. Wherever we go, we carry with us the message of the Good News of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. It is so much a part of us that we cannot help but proclaim the goodness of the Lord and the promises that have been fulfilled in his son, Jesus.

As missionaries, each of us has a circle of influence - those people that we interact with regularly, who look with favor on us, and who listen when we speak. It is to those people that we share the news of Christ most often and most easily. These are the ones who are most receptive to the message.

As St. Paul wrote to the Christians in Thessalonica, he commended them for their “missionary” work. He described the word being spoken as a trumpet sounding a clarion call. Their faith was strong and steady, and they did the work of sharing it with those in their circle of influence. That circle was Macedonia and Achaia, and beyond.

I don't know about your town, but where I live it's a pretty small community when compared to the big, bustling cities that many are used to. Word spreads quickly here. Sometimes I learn about something I did before I even know I did it! (Just kidding!) But, seriously, news does travel fast around my town. It isn't always accurate, but it does move swiftly. Oh, that the Gospel message would travel so fast and be so interesting to talk about on the front porch of all who live around me. Oh, that the best news of all, Jesus' love for us, would spread like wildfire in the way that some rumors and gossip do. Wouldn't it be wonderful to hear through the grapevine that people were receiving the news about Christ and responding to his love and mercy by the droves? That would make my day! Or my year! But sadly, we tend to chat about others sorts of news when we could be spreading the gospel. Jesus helps us sound forth his saving word! May we be missionaries in our own neighborhoods! Amen.

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## Sermon Notes for October 18 – St. Luke

The Lord appointed 72 others and sent them on ahead of him.... Luke 10:1

We have a mission given to us by Jesus just as the 72 did. This is good news – we all need a purpose in life.

As Christian our purpose is driven by our mission to share the Good News. There are some challenging things about this mission:

- Sent out (even now when we are told to stay in)
- Lambs in the midst of wolves (Lambs are helpless in the face of a wolf)
- Take nothing with you (really?)
- You are supposed to heal
- You will be rejected

What's easy about this mission – everything

- Two by two – we are not alone in our mission
- We are lambs but we have a Good Shepherd
- We are provided for by God
- Jesus is the healer
- Even when things are not going well – Jesus is near

That is a key kernel of truth in the Christian message – God has come near to us in Jesus Christ. We don't have a distant, distracted, detached deity, we have a God who so loved that world that he came among us in human flesh and gave his flesh for the sins of the world. God came near and bore the weight of the whole world's sin on the cruel cross – God knows rejection, but he has not rejected us, God knows abandonment, but he has not abandoned us.

We are drawn into his loving embrace and then we are released, not to go it on our own, but to go forth in Jesus name, with Christ above us, before us, beside us – directing our footsteps along right pathways for his name sake.

May God fill your life with power through the Good News of Jesus. May he give you faith, hope and love and keep you strong in following him. Amen. (1 Thessalonians 1:3,5)

### **CARING CONVERSATIONS**

Discuss in your household or small group:

- What symbols or images are on the coins you use? Which is your favorite?
- Jesus said, “Give the Emperor what belongs to him and give God what belongs to God” (Matthew 22:21). What belongs to earthly rulers? What belongs to God?
- How does God use earthly rulers to take care of us? Why is it important to support them? How can we do that?

## **DEVOTIONS**

Paul wrote that the Christians in Thessalonica had become “imitators” of Jesus (1 Thessalonians 2:7). Play a game of “Simon Says.” Then, have a discussion about ways in which we “copy” others in our lives—both in good and bad ways. Discuss what it means to imitate Jesus and to be an example of Christian faith, hope and love to others. Pray for one another, giving thanks for the good work God is doing in and through each person in your home.

## **SERVICE**

Prepare an appreciation card to send to elected officials in your community, state or nation. Thank them for all they are doing to serve your community. Let them know that you are praying for them.

## **RITUALS AND TRADITIONS**

An important faith practice or ritual is regular giving to the Lord through Sunday offerings. Discuss together what your household gives to the Lord. If you have not already done so, develop a regular pattern for setting aside each week what you will give in Sunday offerings. Include each household member in the practice of giving (even very young children can be involved).
