Pastors' Letter for August 2021

⁶Therefore, as you received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in him, ⁷rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving.

Pastor Sally and I have a modest yard with a few flower beds around our house. Each year we try to plant flowers and a few tomato plants, not more than we can handle but enough to make the place look good. The soil at our place naturally has a high clay content which makes placing new plants in the ground, in areas where the soil has not been amended to loosen the clay, quite difficult. Recently I dug up one area that was particularly full of clay, it was quite a chore in the hot weather, but I managed and hopefully it will now house plants more readily.

In our life together in the church some things come more easily than others. Writing the prayers comes more easily than writing a sermon, setting up the sound system for first service, while no piece of cake, comes more easily than setting up for the outdoor sound system. Like Saint Paul long before us we see the hand of our Lord and Savior working in so many ways in the life of the church and continue to pray that we will grow even further in faith and understanding and commitment to Him and to His church. Keeping the church working well is a blessed ministry may we all grow in it together.

CYC is now accepting applications for the 2021-2022 school year for both the 3 and 4-year-old classes. Children need to be either 3 or 4 by the 1st of September.

Registration can be done through saintpaultrinity.org, the CYC webpage, cycpreschool.com, or by calling the church office and requesting a registration form.

The 3-year old's meet 3 days a week from 9:00-12:00 and the 4-year old's meet 5 days a week from 9:00-2:00. Tuition for the 3's is \$135/ month and for the 4's it is \$270/month - both with a nonrefundable registration fee of \$20.00.

After a very lengthy COVID break, we are hoping to resume a regular choir schedule in the Fall, with rehearsals beginning after Labor Day. To assist in our preparations, we would like to know how many people are interested in participating in the music groups. There are a few changes from the pre-COVID schedule; read on for more details.

Interested in a traditional part-singing choral ensemble? Our CHOIR will rehearse on Thursday evenings from 7:15 to 8:15. In the past, this group has sung 3 Sundays per month: twice at the early service, once at late. This schedule may be modified to a 2-Sunday-per-month format, depending on the wishes of the participants. New members are welcome on all voice parts, but we could especially use more men.

HANDBELL ENSEMBLE will rehearse on THURSDAY evenings from 6:30 to 7:15. In the past, this group played for both services on one Sunday per month. We anticipate a similar schedule in the Fall. New members as well as experienced ringers are welcome. We would like to offer a month-long "Handbell Basics" course for the new participants. If you are interested in playing handbells this year and have not played previously, now is the time to join, as the "Handbell Basics" course will be offered only once per year.

We are looking for singers to assist with SECOND SERVICE MUSIC. In the past, these singers performed either as soloists or in small groups, helping to lead congregational singing and providing music during communion.
