First Lesson: **Isaiah 50:4-10**

(God spoke to the exiles about their banishment saying it was only temporary. Through the prophet Isaiah the people heard the song of the Suffering Servant. This one is fully obedient to God, unlike Israel who ignored his will and wandered far from him. Vindication is near and soon the exiles will be freed to return home.)

⁴The Lord God has given me the tongue of those who are taught, that I may know how to sustain with a word him who is weary. Morning by morning he awakens; he awakens my ear to hear as those who are taught. ⁵The Lord God has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious; I turned not backward. ⁶I gave my back to those who strike, and my cheeks to those who pull out the beard; I hid not my face from disgrace and spitting. ⁷But the Lord God helps me; therefore, I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like a flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame. ⁸He who vindicates me is near. Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who is my adversary? Let him come near to me. ⁹Behold, the Lord God helps me; who will declare me guilty? Behold, all of them will wear out like a garment; the moth will eat them up. ¹⁰Who among you fears the Lord and obeys the voice of his servant? Let him who walks in darkness and has no light trust in the name of the Lord and rely on his God.

L: This is the Word of the Lord.

Psalms: 116:1-9 (read responsively)

(The psalmist sang of God lending his ear to him as he cried for help. Though he suffered mightily, the Lord was listening and came to the psalmist's aid. For this reason, he vowed to call on the name of the Lord forever.)

L:¹I love the Lord, because he has heard the voice of my supplication, because he has inclined his ear to me whenever I called upon him.

C:²The cords of death entangled me; the grip of the grave took hold of me; I came to grief and sorrow.

L:³Then I called upon the name of the Lord: "O Lord, I pray you, save my life."

C:⁴Gracious is the Lord and righteous; our God is full of compassion.

L:⁵The Lord watches over the innocent; I was brought very low, and he helped me.

C:⁶Turn again to your rest, O my soul, for the Lord has treated you well.

L:⁷For you have rescued my life from death, my eyes from tears, and my feet from stumbling.

C:⁸I will walk in the presence of the Lord in the land of the living.

L:⁹I believed, even when I said, "I have been brought very low." In my distress I said, "No one can be trusted."

Second Lesson: **James 3:1-12**

(James warned those he wrote to that not many of them ought to become teachers, for teachers have a greater responsibility than others do. He asserted that they will be judged stringently for their behavior and the words that come off their tongues.)

¹Not many of you should become teachers, my brothers, for you know that we who teach will be judged with greater strictness. ²For we all stumble in many ways. And if anyone does not stumble in what he says, he is a perfect man, able also to bridle his whole body. ³If we put bits into the mouths of horses so that they obey us, we guide their whole bodies as well. ⁴Look at the ships also: though they are so large and are driven by strong winds, they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs. ⁵So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great things. How great a forest is set ablaze by such a small fire! ⁶And the tongue is a fire, a world of unrighteousness. The tongue is set among our members, staining the whole body, setting on fire the entire course of life, and set on fire by hell. ⁷For every kind of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by mankind, ⁸but no human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. ⁹With it we bless our Lord and Father, and with it we curse people who are made in the likeness of God. ¹⁰From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers, these things ought not to be so. ¹¹Does a spring pour forth from the same opening both fresh and salt water? ¹²Can a fig tree, my brothers, bear olives, or a grapevine produce figs? Neither can a salt pond yield fresh water.

SPECIAL APPEAL FOR SEPTEMBER - ASAPH TEACHING MINISTRY



Learning the basics in life:

Share, play fair, don't hit

The Basics of the faith:

God loves us

We are weak but he is strong

We need to know of God's love and forgiveness otherwise we might end up blaming Him every time something goes wrong. Knowing He loves us means we can go to Him with all our problems. Knowing that He loves us means we want to please Him.

If we don't admit that we are weak, then we think we can solve all our problems on our own. If we become overconfident (like the disciples), then we will fail to seek God's help.

I believe/help my unbelief is the cry of someone who is a saint and sinner. We want to trust in God, but our pride and other temptations of life get in the way.

Jesus takes charge, ministers to the father, expels the demon and instructs the disciples on how to handle such problems.

We are called to not rely on our own strength to get through the trials of life, but we are to take each care, each challenge, each opportunity and lay it at the feet of our Savior. Why? Because we are weak, but he is strong.

Little ones to Him belong. We need to hear this piece of the song as much as all the rest because it is one of the huge temptations that Satan plants in our lives, when we think our bodies belong to us, our schedules belong to us, our course in life belongs to us – Without this guidance, without this confession, that we belong to Him, then we will be pulled from without and within by the demons and demands of this world.

Back to the Basics: Jesus loves me this I know for the Bible tells me so, little ones to Him belong. We are weak but He is strong!

SCRIPTURE VERSE FOR THIS WEEK:

Praise and cursing come out of the same mouth. My brothers and sisters, it shouldn't be that way. **James 3:10 (NIRV)**

SAY, PRAY AND BLESS:

A Prayer for the Week:

O God, keep me, your servant, from willful sins; may they not rule over me
(Psalm 19.13).

Mealtime Prayer:

Lord Jesus, as we chew and as we swallow, make us strong to love and follow. Amen.

A Blessing to Give:

May God's goodness give you peace of mind and heart, and may God protect you with kindness. Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION:

Discuss in your household or small group:

- Share about a time when you carried something heavy.
- Have you ever been challenged with a task you did not believe you could do, but had no choice but to try? What happened?
- Jesus says that if we want to come after him, we must pick up our cross and follow him. What do you think he means?

DEVOTIONS:

When you gather as a family this week at mealtimes or for your home devotions, begin by making the sign of the cross. This is an ancient Christian tradition that reminds us that we are people saved through the cross of Christ. To make the sign of the cross, bring together your thumb and index and middle fingers. Place them on your forehead, then move down to the sternum, then to the left shoulder across to your right shoulder. As you do so, recite, "In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen."

SERVICE:

We serve others not only through what we do, but also through what we say. We are encouraged to use our tongues to bless others, not hurt them. See James 3.1-9. Aim to be God's "sacred agents" this week in your home, places of work or education, church, and community groups. Set out each day to give at least one compliment or affirmation to someone else. Report back to each other every day about your experiences. Genuine encouragement and praise does wonders for a parent-child relationship and for the self-esteem of children. Parents' words and actions are often the "mirrors" through which children evaluate themselves. Help them to see themselves in God's likeness (James 3:9).

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS:

Visual symbols are a powerful means for communicating our faith and reminding us of Christ's place in our lives. What religious symbols or artwork do you have on display in your home? Place a Christian symbol of some type in every room. Take time to make them yourselves and display them on your walls or furniture.
