PASTOR'S LETTER

“I will sing of the steadfast love of the Lord forever, forever; with my mouth I will make known your faithfulness to all generations.” Psalm 89:1

Pastor Sally and I want to thank the congregation and our CYC Director, Malinda Grube, for the privilege we have had of starting a new ministry in the last several months, a Chapel service once a month in the Nave for CYC preschoolers and their parents and or grandparents. This weekday opportunity is added to the visits we make, and have made for over twenty years, to the CYC itself. Each month the Chapel service includes a welcome, in which we explain something of the church year, and a Biblical lesson conveyed by the puppets we use, music and prayers. It is a short service but bridges the physical gap between their classrooms and the worship area. It is our hope that this service will both enrich the faith lives of those attending and show that Saint Paul is a hospitable place which welcomes families into its full life.

Speaking of full life in Christ, this month we begin our Lenten Journey. It strikes me that the present extremely volatile world and domestic scene only further confirms how much we need the sovereign rule of God over our lives, the God who has given his all, who steadfastly loves us through both good and traumatic times alike. This is an excellent year to in earnest observe the disciplines of Lent, and with our concentration on the Psalms this year, we will gain further insight into what to pray and to bring our petitions before the Lord.

Finally, thank you to the congregation for remaining genuinely strong throughout this Covid mess. We have emerged through two years in which social organizations have really been hit hard, with excellent finances, much vision for the future, many great new members, and new ministries to carry out. Praise be God whose steadfast love endures forever! Amen.

ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA: Motion to adopt the agenda was made by Mike Barndt and 2nd by Lawrence Smyser

MINUTES OF LAST COUNCIL MEETING: Motion to accept the minutes after amendment to New Business. Minutes should state renovation plans for the Nave and not the Narthex, made by Lawrence Smyser and second by Mike Barndt.

PASTORS' REPORT: Presented by Pastor Sally.

SPECIAL ORDER OF BUSINESS: Nave Renovation Task Force in attendance and shared proposal and estimated costs for renovating the nave.

- Estimated cost for proposed renovation is \$118,768, which includes:

Cleaning and sealing the concrete, interior work on stain glass windows, removal of old carpet, purchase, and installation of new carpet, removal of wallpaper, new paint in the nave, choir room and in the stairwell to the choir room, pews to have the wood cleaned up and covered with new upholstery, kneelers to be cleaned
Removal of small hymnals.

Shifting of pews with a decrease of 50 seats.

Color scheme:

Neutral Earth tone colors for the walls

Rich burgundy fabric for the pews

Pattern on carpet with deep reds and browns

Council requested estimate to maintain current seating capacity. Cost increase estimated at \$3,430, for a total cost of \$122,198.

Proposal made by Lawrence Smyser to amend task force proposal and maintain current seating capacity increasing cost by approximately \$3430, proposal second by Donna Rhinehart.

Council voted all in favor with one member opposed.

Motion made by Mike Barndt to present amended proposal of nave renovations to the congregation at the congregational meeting maintaining current seating for estimated cost of \$122,198, and 2nd by Lawrence Smyser.

- Plan to finance the project.
 - Dedicated fund for renovations has close to \$40,000 in the account.
 - Council proposes to borrow remaining sum of money from the endowment fund with plans asking the congregation to make pledges to pay back expenses over the next two years.

CYC is now accepting applications for the 2022-2023 school year for both the 3 and 4-year-old classes.

Children need to be either 3 or 4 by September 1st. Registration can be done through saintpaultrinity.org, the CYC webpage, cycpreschool.com, or by calling the church office and requesting a registration form. The registration fee, first month's tuition and forms are due at the time of enrollment to ensure your child's placement.

The 3-year old's meet three days a week from 9:00 am-12:00 noon, and the 4-year old's meet five days a week from 9:00 am-2:00 pm. Tuition for the 3's is \$135/month, and for the 4's it is \$310/month - both with a nonrefundable registration fee of \$25 before May 1st and \$50 after May 1st.
