Pastor's Letter

“Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing.” I Thessalonians 5:11

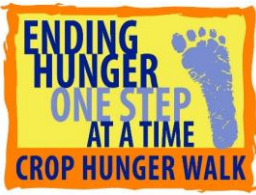

Beginning in October, the Lutheran Theology class will be reading and discussing the *Magdeburg Confession*, covering Lutheran doctrine on the Church's obligation to resist illegitimate impositions by government upon the Church. Shortly after Luther's death, the walled city of Magdeburg defended the Lutheran understanding of faith and worship against the Holy Roman Emperor, who had subdued the other Lutheran territories to restore Roman Catholicism. The pastors of Magdeburg wrote the *Confession* to explain and justify their refusal to submit. Magdeburg sustained a year-long siege by imperial forces and prevailed, saving the Lutheran Reformation.
