Pastor's Reflection

³We ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers, as is right, because your faith is growing abundantly, and the love of every one of you for one another is increasing. ⁴Therefore we ourselves boast about you in the churches of God for your steadfastness and faith in all your persecutions and in the afflictions that you are enduring. 2 Thessalonians 1:3-4

As we come to this month where we as Americans take a specific national holiday of giving thanks, I offer this short reflection for your encouragement and in continuation of Pastor Sally's fine letter in October. Notice how, in our quote above, Saint Paul manages to thank both God and the Thessalonians he is addressing for doing the work of God. While it is true that we could all be more thankful to God for the countless blessings he showers upon us, we should extend this thanks to those who help bring those blessings in his name. One way to combine thanks to God and to His children is to simply say "I thank God for your _____ (and then express your specific thanks for what they have done or are doing). This kind of combined thanksgiving both encourages the person in their efforts, and also places their work in the larger context of what God is doing through them.

Church life provides a good illustration for this as we give thanks to those who do a myriad of tasks around the church. For example, we can thank teachers for the lesson they prepared, our Lord's Helpers for helping to carry out the jobs they do in worship, and so on. Now one could try to rebuff this by saying they were just doing their duty, but doing the work of the Kingdom, or not, is a choice people make. When people step up to the plate, God bless them for their commitment. Just ask yourself who in life has encouraged you, who has helped to motivate you to do your best, and have you been that person for others.

As people who know who their Savior is, who have been born anew to a living hope in the waters of Holy Baptism, we have been given the greatest gift of all. May our thanksgiving to God overflow in gratitude to Him and to his people, and as this happens just see what the Lord will do!
