## HARVEST OF HOPE

The Harvest of Hope Food Pantry, located at 4485 Wolf's Church Road York PA 17408, opened in September 2004. The facility is supported by volunteers, board members, and finances from Saint Paul Lutheran Trinity Road, as well as 11 other churches locally. In addition, dozens of businesses, organizations, and individuals provide financial and food donation support throughout the year. In October 2006, an addition to the existing building was needed to adequately store and distribute food to the clients. Each church volunteers to distribute food to clients on a rotating schedule, usually once a month. Look for a schedule to sign up to volunteer on the table in the library area.
