PASTOR'S LETTER

I almost became a Presbyterian when I was in fourth grade. I needed a hernia operation, which in those ancient times meant ten days in the Sunbury Hospital. I had asked my parents to notify our church office, so I expected our pastors to visit me. But day after day they didn't come.

However, there was a wonderful Presbyterian minister in town named Charles Almond, who was a sort of town chaplain. He walked the streets, spoke to everybody, and was always available for conversation (not to recruit members from other churches, I might add). Shortly into my stay in the hospital, he saw my name on the list and visited and prayed with me. (Later in life I learned he was a pretty impressive preacher, and I still own books he gave me after he retired).

This fourth grader was furious at my pastors and ready to switch churches. Finally, near the end of my stay Pastor Koons came, apologizing profusely that he hadn't realized I was in the hospital. I asked my mother whether she had notified the church, and she sheepishly admitted that she didn't want to bother our pastors with what she didn't consider a big deal. Obviously, she didn't understand the difference between a major and a minor operation: All my operations are major, and all your operations are minor.

A couple of points. First, please let us know of folks who need pastoral care either in a hospital or at home. Since many procedures (like mine so long ago) are now done on an outpatient basis, a home visit with prayer and anointing is often the best way to provide that care. Second, that includes family members, friends, and co-workers who are not active in a church. Obviously ask their permission before referring them to me, but I believe that a pastor is not only to provide ministry to the members of the congregation, but to all those in a community to whom we might be able to offer Christ's love.

Pastor Brad Hales led a helpful workshop for our NALC pastors in Orlando, telling us we need to find ways to be visible in our community. My experience as a child confirms what he said. I am just not sure what our "community" is at St. Paul, or how to be visible in it. And I would like to start some things that you would want your called pastor to continue.

My current thought is that our "community" is not defined so much by a location as by our membership. Our "community" is the people our members interact with on a regular basis. There are many people you and I meet every day who need to experience the hope of the Gospel. In some of those cases, you may be the person to put them in contact with Jesus.

You can begin by praying each morning for God to show you the people whose lives you might impact for Christ on that day. You should pray to be the sort of person whose life attracts others in a positive way. (see a book by Greg Finke, *Joining Jesus on His Mission*). Be a good listener — don't go after people like a timeshare salesperson. Offer to pray with them if it seems appropriate and connect them with me if that might be helpful.

As we pray and serve together, I believe we can impact a much bigger community than a town like Sunbury in the era of Charles Almond. Can we strive together to join Jesus in his mission here in York County and beyond? Steve Shipman, STS - Interim Pastor

Information Regarding Possible Ordination of Linda Shipman

Linda Shipman, a member of St. Paul and the wife of our interim pastor, has been leading worship in a number of smaller area churches that have had difficulty finding pastors to supply for them. Most but not all are ELCA and largely abandoned by the synod because of their size.

Linda was a trained Authorized Lay Worship Leader in the Upper Susquehanna Synod of the ELCA, and the pastor who taught preaching in that program is now a retired NALC pastor (Chris Milarch). She assisted her husband in his ministry to five churches in the Lock Haven area, usually leading two services twice a month plus various festivals. Even after he took the position with Lutheran CORE, the synod called upon her from time to time to supply until they moved to the Dillsburg area.

In looking for ways that she can preside at services of Word and Sacrament in these churches, the suggestion from LCMC is that St. Paul ordain her as a contract pastor to be deployed to serve neighboring churches. This evidently has been done a number of places in LCMC; Trinity in Joppa Maryland is one such congregation sending contract pastors to assist neighboring churches. Pastor Karin Pejack of Zion in Harrisburg (LCMC) has also expressed interest in using her from time to time.

LCMC believes that it is the congregation that ordains and recognizes two kinds of pastors. Those with seminary degrees or the equivalent can be certified pastors, available for call in other congregations. Contract pastors are ordained to serve on behalf of the congregation that ordains them and are not available for other calls. Linda does not expect to preach or lead worship at St. Paul should the congregation agree to ordain her, but to continue being available for smaller churches in the area looking for faithful Word and Sacrament supply ministry.

Some members have requested to hear Linda preach when she will not need to introduce herself or share her personal testimony as she did on the previous occasion. She is scheduled to preach on the Sunday after Easter, April 7, at both services. Pastor Steve will preside at the Communion, since of course Linda will not be ordained at that point.

There will be a special congregational meeting to vote whether to ordain her as a contract pastor in LCMC, and the vote will be taken by paper ballot after each service on April 7, as we do with the council elections.

Once a new pastor is called, that pastor will serve as supervisor for Linda and her continued service will be under the new pastor's authority.

Help us to continue to be your disciples and to be your shining light every day as we embark through this process. We pray for your wisdom and for the ability to discern who you have called to serve our beloved church for the foreseeable future. Father, we also pray for the Call Committee that will be giving of their time and effort through prayer and support to find God's chosen pastor for our church. Help us to accept and understand your timeline to determine the call for our next pastor, and to not rush the process through our sometimes-limited patience.

We pray for all of this in Jesus Name. Amen




