PASTOR'S LETTER

I had a brilliant idea a few years ago. I signed Linda and me up for ballroom dancing classes. Please don't ask her how it went. (Hint: She won't let me go to another Senior Expo alone).

One time our teacher was determined that we would go to New Orleans for a major dance competition. We wouldn't have done it anyhow (we really aren't that good), but the teacher couldn't comprehend why we made it clear we would not participate in a dance competition on the weekend of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter.

The highlight of my year, even though it is physically and emotionally exhausting, is to walk with our Lord from Palm Sunday through Holy Week and Easter. It helps me refocus my life on God's loving purpose for me and for all his people. I live for all the special worship services. Traditionally Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday are understood as one service over the course of four days. I have never understood why so many folks are only present for one part of this liturgical drama and miss the exciting plot. (I had a member once who only showed up at church on Maundy Thursday. I always felt she missed the best part!)

It is easy to forget that all these things we re-live during Holy Week actually happened. And the story of Jesus and his salvation has not ended. Through our Baptism into Christ, we are also included in it. Holy Week is indeed the most important chapter of our life story, and the conclusion of the story won't be written until Jesus returns to establish his Kingdom in the new heaven and the new earth.

Until then our struggles and pain are real. I always have believed that in the movie version of *Lord of the Rings*, Peter Jackson omitted one of the most important parts — the epilog when the Hobbits needed to eradicate the remaining evil in the Shire even after the Ring had been destroyed and Sauron defeated. That is the equivalent in Tolkien's story of where we are. The ultimate victory has been won by Jesus, but we are still involved in the clean-up operations.

Holy Week defines who we are and where we stand in the history of God's redemptive acts. I urge you to make time to worship with us and live through the whole drama. Then go

forth during the Fifty Days of Easter and beyond to continue the work God has entrusted to us, to spread the Good News to the whole world and serve our neighbors in Jesus' Name..

The war is won, but the battles continue. And that is what Holy Week reminds us, giving us the strength to face every day in faith, hope, and love.

OPENING DEVOTIONS: Led by Pastor Shipman

ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA: A motion to adopt the agenda was made by Eva Phillips and 2nd by Barb Eisenhart. A voice vote was unanimously all in favor.

MINUTES OF LAST COUNCIL MEETING: A motion to accept the minutes was made by Ed Dunklebarger and 2nd by Eva Phillips. A voice vote was unanimously all in favor.

PASTORS' REPORT: Presented by Pastor Steve Shipman.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

MINISTRY OF RESOURCES – Prayer offered by Eva Phillips

FINANCE – Motion to accept the treasurer's report made by Ed Dunklebarger and 2nd by Terri Masemer. A voice vote was unanimously all in favor. The Morgan Stanley endowment fund is at \$673,841 and the scholarship fund is at \$128,355. There was an unexpected cost of about \$2,600 to rebuild a firewall. Capital appeal funds have been transferred to the Nave Renovations Account. The next meeting is April 8, 9:00 am.

MUTUAL MINISTRY – As needed.

PROPERTY – A motion was made to set up a dedicated account titled “emergency generator” to cover the installation of one generator at the cost of about \$30,000 by Ed Dunklebarger and 2nd by Terri Masemer. A voice vote was unanimously all in favor. Painting in Fellowship Hall is finished, the ceilings and windows were also cleaned, and the AED pads have been replaced. Three new interior cameras will be installed at a cost of \$4,890. On April 6, at 8:00 am the committee will be having an outside work detail. Next Meeting June 11th, 6:00 pm.

SCHOLARSHIP—The committee has decided that a total of 4 scholarships will be given out. Incomplete applications will not be accepted. Applications will be available this Sunday, March 17.

CENTER FOR YOUNG CHILDREN PRESCHOOL (CYC)

CYC preschool is now accepting applications for the 2024-2025 school year for the 3-year-old class. The 4-year-old class is currently full. Children need to be 3 by September 1st. The registration fee, first month's tuition and forms are due at the time of enrollment to ensure your child's placement.
